COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course will follow Colorado Academic Standards for 6th Grade mathematics. It will examine and strengthen the foundations of number theory, mathematical operations & properties, and proportional relationships. This course is designed to be a bridge from computational strategies into pre-algebra concepts. The units covered in this course will include:

- Operations and Properties
- Introduction to Algebra
- Decimals
- Number Theory and Fractions
- Fraction Operations
- Data Collection and Analysis
- Proportional Relationships
- Measurement and Geometry
- Integers and the Coordinate Plane
- Functions

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Chapter Exams and Quizzes

All chapter exams and quizzes may be retaken if a student wishes to improve his/her score. In order to retake any chapter test or quiz, the student must correct all his/her original mistakes, write a brief explanation of his/her learning and obtain a retake contract from Mr. Gravelle to be signed by the student's parent/guardian.

ANY RETAKE MUST BE COMPLETED WITHIN 2 WEEKS OF THE ORIGINAL ASSESSMENT!

Effort

Homework will vary depending on the unit. It is used to reinforce classroom learning, practice skills, and prepare for the next lesson. It is always better to attempt the assigned problems than to skip the assignment.

Participation includes being on time, coming prepared for class, and actively participating in classroom discussions and activities.

Attendance

Students are given 15 attendance points each semester. Students are given two "free" unexcused absences and two "free" unexcused tardies without penalty. Once a student reaches his/her third tardy or unexcused absence, the following deductions will occur:

3-point deduction for each absence beyond the second absence

1-point deduction for each tardy beyond the second tardy

LATE WORK

If a student is absent on the day an assignment is due, he or she may turn in the assignment at the start of the next class period. For every day absent, one additional day will be added to the due date.

When an assignment is late, students will lose 10% of the possible points for each day an assignment is late. Students will not receive credit after 10 days or the end of the unit, whichever comes first.
